### ENG1D1

This course is designed to develop the oral communication, reading, writing, and media literacy skills that students need for success in their secondary school academic programs and in their daily lives. Students will analyse literary texts from contemporary and historical periods, interpret informational and graphic texts, and create oral, written, and media texts in a variety of forms. An important focus will be on the use of strategies that contribute to effective communication. The course is intended to prepare students for the Grade 10 academic English course, which leads to university or college preparation courses in Grades 11 and 12. When choosing Grade 9 Academic English you will also be selecting Grade 9 Academic Geography and Academic French.

**COURSE NOTE:** It is recommended that English, French and Geography are taken at the same level of study/career pathway to match expected reading and writing skills. Please talk to your child's principal if you would like to discuss this further.

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### English

### ENG1P1

This course is designed to develop the key oral communication, reading, writing, and media literacy skills students need for success in secondary school and daily life. Students will read, interpret, and create a variety of informational, literary, and graphic texts. An important focus will be on identifying and using appropriate strategies and processes to improve students' comprehension of texts and to help them communicate clearly and effectively. The course is intended to prepare students for the Grade 10 applied English course, which leads to college or workplace preparation courses in Grades 11 and 12.

**COURSE NOTE:** It is recommended that English, French and Geography are taken at the same level of study/career pathway to match expected reading and writing skills. Please talk to your child's principal if you would like to discuss this further.

### ENG2D1

This course is designed to extend the range of oral communication, reading, writing, and media literacy skills that students need for success in their secondary school academic programs and in their daily lives. **ENG2P1**

This course is designed to extend the range of oral communication, reading, writing, and media literacy skills that students need for success in secondary school and daily life. Students will study and create a variety of informational, literary, and graphic texts. An important focus will be on the consolidation of strategies and processes that help students interpret texts and communicate clearly and effectively. This course is intended to prepare students for the compulsory Grade 11 college or workplace preparation course.

**COURSE NOTE:** We recommend English and History are taken at the same stream/pathway to match expected reading and writing skills. Please talk to a Guidance Counsellor if you would like to discuss this further.

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## English

**ENG3C1**

This course emphasizes the development of literacy, communication, and critical and creative thinking skills necessary for success in academic and daily life. Students will study the content, form, and style of a variety of informational and graphic texts, as well as literary texts from Canada and other countries, and create oral, written, and media texts in a variety of forms for practical and academic purposes. An important focus will be on using language with precision and clarity. The course is intended to prepare students for the compulsory Grade 12 college preparation course.

**CREDIT:** 1

**TYPE:** College

**GRADE:** 11

**PREREQUISITE:** ENG2P1 - English **or** ENG2D1 - English

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## English

**ENG3U1**

This course emphasizes the development of literacy, communication, and critical and creative thinking skills necessary for success in academic and daily life. Students will analyse challenging literary texts from various periods, countries, and cultures, as well as a range of informational and graphic texts, and create oral, written, and media texts in a variety of forms. An important focus will be on using language with precision and clarity and incorporating stylistic devices appropriately and effectively. The course is intended to prepare students for the compulsory Grade 12 university or college preparation course.

**CREDIT:** 1

**TYPE:** University

**GRADE:** 11

**PREREQUISITE:** ENG2D1 - English

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## English

**ENG4C1**

This course emphasizes the consolidation of literacy, communication, and critical and creative thinking skills necessary for success in academic and daily life. Students will analyse a variety of informational and graphic texts, as well as literary texts from various countries and cultures, and create oral, written, and media texts in a variety of forms for practical and academic purposes. An important focus will be on using language with precision and clarity and developing greater control in writing. The course is intended to prepare students for college or the workplace.

**CREDIT:** 1

**PREREQUISITE:** ENG3C1 - English **or** ENG3U1 - English

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## **English**

**ENG4U1**

This course emphasizes the consolidation of the literacy, communication, and critical and creative thinking skills necessary for success in academic and daily life. Students will analyse a range of challenging literary texts from various periods, countries, and cultures; interpret and evaluate informational and graphic texts; and create oral, written, and media texts in a variety of forms. An important focus will be on using academic language coherently and confidently, selecting the reading strategies best suited to particular texts and particular purposes for reading, and developing greater control in writing. The course is intended to prepare students for university, college, or the workplace.

**CREDIT:** 1

**TYPE:** University

**GRADE:** 12

**PREREQUISITE:** ENG3U1 - English

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## **Studies in Literature - Film based**

**ETS4C1**

This course is for students with a special interest in literature. The course may focus on themes, genres, time periods, or countries. Students will study a variety of forms and stylistic elements of literary texts and respond personally, critically, and creatively to them. They will also investigate critical interpretations, and complete an independent study project

**CREDIT:** 1

**TYPE:** College

**GRADE:** 12

**PREREQUISITE:** ENG3U1 - English **or** ENG3C1 - English

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## **Studies in Literature - Film based**

**ETS4U1**

This course is for students with a special interest in literature and literary criticism. The course may focus on themes, genres, time periods, or countries. Students will analyse a range of forms and stylistic elements of literary texts and respond personally, critically, and creatively to them. They will also assess critical interpretations, write analytical essays, and complete an independent study project.

**CREDIT:** 1

**TYPE:** University

**GRADE:** 12

**PREREQUISITE:** ENG3U1 - English

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## **Ontario Secondary School Literacy Course**

**OLC4O1**

This course is designed to help students acquire and demonstrate the cross-curricular literacy skills that are evaluated by the Ontario Secondary School Literacy Test (OSSLT). Students who complete the course successfully will meet the provincial literacy requirement for graduation. Students will read a variety of informational, narrative, and graphic texts and will produce a variety of forms of writing, including summaries, information paragraphs, opinion pieces, and news reports. Students will also maintain and manage a portfolio containing a record of their reading experiences and samples of their writing.

**COURSE NOTE:** This course is recommended for Grade 12 students who are missing their Ontario Secondary School Literacy requirement which is needed to graduate.

**TYPE:** Open

**GRADE:** 12
